Temporary Shopping Area

What is Temporary Shopping Area?

A temporary shopping area is a group of temporary prefabricated shops and restaurants. Most of them are developed and lent to the shop owners for free by the government. They needed it because they cannot rebuild their permanent shops in their old sites immediately due to the tsunami. And then, it is also essential for the residents to revitalize local community.



Temporary Shopping Area in Rikuzen-Takata

Shop Owners had to Rebuild their Temporary Shops by Themselves.

Now, there are 57 groups of temporary shops in Rikuzen-Takata. 6 groups of them are temporary shopping area. Since the support by the city government was insufficient, therefore the other groups only consist of 2 or 3 temporary shops. Shop owners had to lead the development of their temporary shops by themselves. It is more financial and time consuming for them. But, the shop owners of 6 groups had developed their shopping area for "Local revitalization" with the support by NPO.

Rikuzen-Takata city government has imposed 1-3 works on the shop owners though the city government should do. Financial and time consuming prevented them to gather.

Problem

3 years after the disaster, a temporary city center was formed in Rikuzen-Takata. But on the other hand, the deadline of lending period is approaching. And then, the shop owners cannot decide whether they stay the temporary site or rebuild their permanent shops in old city center.


