Noun Clauses

A noun clause is a dependent clause that works like a noun. You can find it as a subject, object, or the compliment of a subject.

There are three types of common noun clauses:

(1) "That" clauses *He knows that noun clauses are difficult.*

(2) "If" clauses:*I* don't know if my students have studied noun clauses before.The teacher must determine if they are ready to study noun clauses.

(3) Wh-clauses that begin with words like who, what, how, whenever, which, etc.:*I don't know which noun clauses to teach.You first need to explain what a noun clause is.*
