Writing Handout 19 - Avoiding "I" in Writing

Formal writing can sound childish if the word "I" is used too often. Even if the goal of the writing is to argue a point, it will sound more persuasive if a more objective tone can be achieved.

Read Paragraph A and circle every "I" you find (there are 7), and then read Paragraph B. Note how the subject has changed.

Paragraph A

I think that the Harajuku area of Tokyo is the most exciting in the city. I often go there on weekends. After I walk along Takeshita Avenue, which has very trendy and inexpensive clothing shops, I go to Omotesando Street, which has many top designers' stores.
