GERUNDS AND INFINITIVES

Gerunds and infinites can be tricky to use. This sheet will give some background information on how to use them.

A <u>gerund</u> is a verb form with an **-ing** ending. An <u>infinitive</u> is a verb form with the construction of to + verb. Gerunds and infinitives can be found in many different places in a sentence. One place is after a main verb. The main verb usually determines if a gerund is used or if an infinitive is used.

Examples:

- You should avoid talking to your boss when he is upset.
- She misses eating food from her home country.
- I suggest taking some extra money for your trip.

Examples:

- He claimed to have the winning lottery ticket.
- We decided to make a web page together.
- I want to learn another language.

Of course, there are many more verbs than those listed here.



You must learn which verbs can be used as gerunds or as infinitives. There is no magic way to know which to use. You must just practice and become familiar with the verbs.

You should also know that there is another way that gerunds and infinitives can be used. Sometimes they can be used as the subject of a sentence. Don't be tricked because they are verb forms...they are really acting like nouns!

Examples:

- Drawing is one of my hobbies.
- Swimming is a fun summer activity.
- To make mistakes is human.
- To be friends with him is trouble.
