

Japanese references = written all in Japanese (but the CITATION that is in the report is in romaji)

References should be in alphabetical order.

Author family name first, then regular name. You can write the regular name, like "Brian", as an initial. Example: Rubrecht, B.

Use either the original author name or the translator's name as the citation and reference author.

Blank lines between the references!!!
